**Context-** The poet tells the story of a Man and a Mad Dog. He tells us about the type of the life the Man lived.

**Explanation-** The poet says that the Man lived in Islington. He knew something about the life of the Man. The Man led a life of morality based on religious principles. But this sort of life of the Man was limited to the period of his prayer time. His morality was confined to his prayer time.

- (b) **Reference-** These lines refer to the poem "Risks". The poem is composed by Janet Rand.  
**Context-** These are the opening lines of the poem. The poet says that risk is involved in everything which we do.

**Explanation-** The poet says that laughing is a simple activity. But the person who laughs, finds himself being looked at as fool by others thus to laugh is risky. It is also risky to weep. A person who weeps, covers the risk of being called sentimental. Like wise if one goes out to help someone, he takes the risk of having his own interests in doing so. If we express our feelings before others, there is a risk of showing our privacy.
